The Post Draft Issue grades a team's offseason a little differently than most. The grades we put into Power Sweep predict whether a team's record will improve or decline for the upcoming season. We take EVERYTHING into account. Included in the analysis are coaching changes, the NFL Draft, Free Agent signings, Free Agent losses and even favorable or unfavorable schedules. The "A" & "D" grades have been extremely accurate over the years. We spend a great deal of time and effort making these grades and while there was no list in '11 (work stoppage), here is a recap of the past 22 years as well as the record from the last 8 years with grades ('09, '10 & '12-'17).

In 2017 we released a total of 7 teams which earned either an "A" or "D" grade. 5 of the 7 teams were correct with the Browns ("A" team, worse record) and Jets ("D" team, same record) failing to come through. ("A" teams went 3-1 and "D" teams went 2-0-1).

These "A" and "D" are a huge help in determining which teams to bet on using the Vegas Over/Under season total. THIS YEAR THERE ARE 7 MORE TEAMS WITH THOSE VERY SPECIAL "A" and "D" GRADES.

## NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS..... GRADE: B-

OFFENSE 394 ypg (#1) Patriots: +28.1 ypg (#9) DEFENSE 366 ypg (#29) SCORING 28.6 ppg (#2) +6 TO's +10.1 ppg (#1) 18.5 ppg (#5)

**Offense:** While the loss of Edelman for the 1st 4 gms is worth mentioning, the Patriots' offense remains stacked with playmakers led by the duo of Brady and Gronk. There are some significant losses with the departures of Lewis, Cooks and Solder but we expect Belichick and company to have another solid campaign. Grade: **EVEN**

**Defense:** The biggest loss for the NE defense comes with the departure of DC Patricia (new DET HC). The remainder of the unit stayed virtually intact other than the loss of former All-Pro CB Malcolm Butler. While the ppg allowed was one of the league's best in '17 (18.5, #5), the overall total yards allowed (366 ypg, #29) will need some improvement. Grade: **EVEN**

**Overview:** The Patriots remain amongst the elite in the NFL with a 5th SB appearance this decade a possibility for the 2018 season. The biggest question will be just how much Tom Brady has left in the tank and whether or not a consistent foe can begin to challenge them in the AFC.

## BUFFALO BILLS..... GRADE: D+

OFFENSE 303 ypg (#29) Bills: -52. ypg (#29) DEFENSE 355 ypg (#26) SCORING 18.9 ppg (#22) +9 TO's -3.6 ppg (#21) 22.4 ppg (#18)

**Offense:** The Bills offense will look much different in '18 following the departure of QB Taylor and a good portion of their OL. While FA addition QB McCarron showed some glimpses of promise during his days with CIN, he could be looking over his shoulder following the drafting of Allen in the first round. The Bills will likely take a hit in their offensive production this year. Grade: **DOWN**

**Defense:** HC Sean McDermott and DC Leslie Frazier did a solid job with this unit a year ago en route to their playoff berth. This year's additions and deletions are relatively even giving BUF a solid chance to see some mild improvement in the 2nd year under the new regime. Grade: **EVEN**

**Overview:** While BUF was able to end their 17-year postssn absence in '17, the overall departures on the off side of the ball are alarming. The biggest concern may come with their sked over the 1st 2 months however as BUF has to travel on 5 occasions over the first 7 wks. While the final month of the yr features 4 winnable gms, BUF's chances of reaching the playoffs for a 2nd consec year are very unlikely.

## MIAMI DOLPHINS..... GRADE: C+

OFFENSE 308 ypg (#25) Dolphins: -28.0 ypg (#25) DEFENSE 336 ypg (#16) SCORING 17.6 ppg (#28) -14 TO's -7.0 ppg (#29) 24.6 ppg (#29)

**Offense:** The loss of QB Tannehill the past 2 years have derailed the overall success of the offense. This year they lose their primary receiving threat in Landry but do bolster their running game with the addition of Gore. The Dolphins could see some progression from this unit in '18. Grade: **EVEN**

**Defense:** While the Dolphins part ways with DL Suh, the biggest question comes at LB as MIA has quite a bit of inexperience at the position. The addition of Fitzpatrick in the secondary will help but this is still a below average unit. Grade: **EVEN**

**Overview:** It was a rough 2017 for the Dolphins' faithful as they finished 28th a year ago in points scored and an even worse 29th in points allowed. Much of their 2018 success will come from whether or not Ryan Tannehill can return from his 2nd ACL in as many years. Unfortunately, the early portion of the schedule appears to be challenging for the 2nd straight year. MIA will be in a battle with the Jets to stay out of the AFC basement for a 2nd consec ssn.

## NEW YORK JETS..... GRADE: B

OFFENSE 305 ypg (#28) Jets: -47.3 ypg (#28) DEFENSE 352 ypg (#25) SCORING 18.6 ppg (#24) -4 TO's -5.3 ppg (#26) 23.9 ppg (#22)

**Offense:** The Jets finally addressed a big need for their team after the drafting of QB Sam Darnold. While it's unclear on whether he'll begin his rookie campaign as the starter, new OC Jeremy Bates has some undervalued weapons at his disposal in '18. Grade: **UP**

**Defense:** Although the team made some solid moves to bolster the overall defensive unit, the projected starting lineup features 8 players with less than 5 years of NFL experience. That lack of veteran leadership will likely cause another low finish in the overall defensive rankings for the upcoming year. Grade: **EVEN**

**Overview:** While the Jets were forecasted to be one of the league's worst a year ago with a depleted roster, HC Todd Bowles deserves some credit for exceeding the low expectations. Regardless of who gets the bulk of the snaps at QB for the upcoming year, this young team is at least another year away from earning their first playoff berth since 2010.

**Defense:** With the defensive roster upgraded to players that fit Phillips' 3-4 scheme including a dangerous duo at CB in Peters and Talib, the Rams should contend for their 2nd Top 10 finish in 3 seasons. Grade: UP

**Overview:** After 13 consecutive years of 8 wins or fewer including 6 last place finishes in the NFC West during that span, the Rams have some renewed confidence entering their 3rd year back in Los Angeles. With 5 winnable games to close out the year including a big Wk 15 home matchup against the defending SB champion Eagles, the Rams should be in contention for a 2nd consecutive NFC West title.
